COAST

Laurie Westcott has booked 5 cabins at Burrawang Coastal Club, Guerilla Bay, with the Manager, Len Hegh, for the dates:

IN after 4.00 pm Fri 21 May and OUT before 3.00 pm Sun 23 May. There is a limit of 5 cabins without seeking the Burrawang Cttee's OK to occupy more (the Burrawang CC is for members and there's a limit on the number that can be taken up by anyone at one time. Laurie can book more if there is demand but would need to know fairly quickly. To keep the cabins we are now required to pay a

holding deposit of \$68/cabin in the next few weeks. The cabins normally accommodate up to 6 people -a d/b down stairs and 2x s/b (with another 2x s/mattresses on the floor) upstairs. However, 2 of the allocated cabins have a d/b upstairs (instead of the s/beds) as well as downstairs. The cost per cabin is \$93 a night. Its necessary to provide own bed linen, towels, toiletries and food. No TV or telephone in cabins. No pets allowed. Plenty of seascapes and good walks and photographic opportunities around both cabins and close by.

The cabins were to be available both to SSCC members who wanted a w/end (Fri/Sat nights) at the coast as well as those who wanted to go on the Saturday 4WD/car trip through Wadbilliga and stay at Burrawang for the Saturday night/Sunday. Cabins required for the Saturday night only incur an additional \$20 surcharge (\$93+\$20).

Nikon has released v2.2.4 of its
Capture NX2 software for Mac.

NIKON UPDATES CAMERA CONTROL PRO SOFTWARE

Nikon has updated its Camera Control Pro remote control software to recognize the firmware changes in its D3 and D700 DSLRs. Version 2.7.1 modifies the behaviors of Auto ISO and Focus tracking to reflect the revisions made in the recent firmware updates.

OLYMPUS PENS FIRMWARE V1.2 FOR E-P1

Olympus has released a firmware update for its E-P1 Micro Four Thirds camera. Version 1.2 changes the duration of the enlarged MF



Assist view, 'to improve operability'. It also changes the camera's behavior when the screen backlight is turned off. Firmware updates can be downloaded via the Olympus Master/Studio software.

EQUIPMENT

SAMYANG 14MM F/2.8 IF ED MC ASPHERICAL



The improved model Samyang 14mm f/2.8 lens has been just produced and is subject to the final tests. The optics was changed by redesigning the aspherical lens.

The first lens is made of the optical glass, while the second is of the hybrid construction.

The aforementioned developments allowed us to improve picture resolution at the edges of a photo by 15%, without affecting the chromatic aberration. The second change was redesigning antireflective coatings and limiting internal reflections, which made the lens more resistant to the flare. The lens will be available in Poland and entire Europe at the end of March. The retail price has been established at 329 Euro. The product will be compatible with the following systems: Canon, Nikon, Pentax, Sony, Olympus 4/3

OLYMPUS UNVEILS THE AFFORDABLE PEN



Olympus has officially announced the E-PL1, a simplified, less expensive addition in its Micro-Four Thirds camera range.

With an MSRP of \$599/€599/£549 the latest PEN includes many of the features of its big brothers, the EP-1 and EP-2 and also adds a built-in flash. We've had an E-PL1 for the past few days and have put together a hands-on preview that we hope will provide a little more insight than the bare specs and press images carelessly left lying around the internet. Had we been told by Olympus that if you leak materials you still get a hands-on then we would have published all this much earlier.

OLYMPUS 9-18MM AND 14-150MM FOR MICRO FOUR THIRDS

Olympus has given more detail of the two Micro Four Thirds lenses it announced in November 2009. First is the tiny 9-18mm F4-5.6



wideangle zoom, which becomes the second lens to feature Olympus's clever collapsing barrel design, making it less than half the size of the corresponding Four Thirds lens for carrying. It offers a 100 degree angle-of-view and will be available in May 2010 for about \$700. Second is the 14-150mm F4-5.6 superzoom, which again is much smaller and lighter than the equivalent SLR lens; it will be available in June 2010 priced around \$600. Both lenses feature lightweight single-element internal focus units for quieter, more responsive autofocus.

HASSELBLAD RELEASES H4D-40 MEDIUM FORMAT CAMERA



Hasselblad has launched the H4D-40, 40 megapixel medium format camera. It incorporates a 33 x 44mm CCD sensor (almost twice the size of a full-frame 35mm

DSLR sensor) and includes the 'True Focus' AF system introduced in the H4D-50 and 60. The H4D-40 kit, including camera body, 80mm lens and viewfinder is available at a retail price of US \$19,955

(£12,995) and includes the company's Phocus 2.0 software.

KENKO RELEASES CONVERTERS FOR CANON & NIKON

Kenko has updated three of its teleconverters available for both Canon and Nikon mounts. The DGX versions now communicate the effective focal length and aperture of the lens/converter

combination to the camera for recording in the EXIF data. The PRO 300 AF 2.0x DGX

MC4 AF 1.4x DGX and MC7 AF 2.0x DGX are otherwise the same as previous 'DG' versions.

SILICON POWER ANNOUNCES 128GB 400X

Silicon Power has announced the world's first 128GB 400x Compact Flash card. Offering the largest storage capacity we've yet seen with write
