Portrait Interest Group - 27 May 17

Eight club members met at the Old Parliament House at 09:30 in the morning to make images in the gardens. Lighting conditions varied from cloudy to sunny. Four models joined us, one for the first time. The make-up artist unfortunately couldn't make it, much to the disappointment of the models. One, however, went to her house and had make-up put on before joining us.

Nicky made a beautiful cape of autumn leaves which the models wore for some of the set-ups. We had various methods to deal with the challenging light, including backlighting, strobes, reflectors and having the model stand in open shade next to a brightly lit area providing light from the side. Backdrops included autumn leaves, hedges, flower bushes and a double row of white columns. We also tried capturing model reflections in a pond; this worked better when the sun went behind the clouds.

After about an hour and a half we adjourned to the cafe at Old Parliament House for coffee and snacks. There was much discussion about the shoot and what we could do in the future. There was consensus that the PIG was helping to build confidence and skills in creating portraits. We laughed and chatted for a good while. The models joined us for the first hour and it was almost two hours before the club members finished chatting and dispersed.

Presidents Report

Recently, several members have raised the issue of whether the Club should consider incorporation.

We are aware that there are other members who see more benefit in our current unincorporated situation which has served the Club well for 27+ years. One of the major benefits being that the Club can retain its unique nature, informality and friendly spirit.

Incorporation does not in itself imply a change in the way we operate, but it would necessarily require a more formal structure in running our meetings and the administration of the Club.

There would be considerable time and effort required to incorporate. Establishment costs would likely be in excess of \$250, and ongoing public liability insurance (\$20 Million cover) would costs of around \$1,180. These are estimates only. To adequately fund this, assuming current membership levels, would require an increase of around \$10 in Single and Family annual memberships.

So why should we consider incorporation? Put simply, to transfer any financial risk from the members of the Club to the legal entity which would be created.

An informal discussion at our June meeting would seem to be warranted so that the extent of members interest, for and against incorporating, can be more widely measured. No decision will be taken, simply an airing of the topic.

For Discussion & Decision - Access to Club Bank Account - Submission by the Secretary/Treasurer

Currently, only the treasurer has access to the Club Bank Account with Beyond Bank.

I am concerned that the club will not be able to access funds, if needed, if the treasurer is not available. At least one other club member should have access to the account. Also this would provide validation of bank transfers to ensure club funds are spent for club activities and assets.

The system with Beyond Bank works as follows.

Transfer of Treasurer role:

- The new Treasurer creates a membership account with Beyond Bank.
- The new and current Treasurer visit a Beyond Bank branch together.
- The current Treasurer signs paperwork allowing Beyond Bank to link the club account to new Treasurer's membership account.
- The new Treasurer signs paperwork removing the current Treasurer from the club account.

For another person to access the account:

- They would create a membership account with Beyond Bank.
- The Treasurer signs paperwork allowing them to access the account.

To remove access to the account:

• The Treasurer signs paperwork removing the person from the account.

Any transfers out of the account are the responsibility of the Treasurer alone, and would be monitored by the additional person to ensure valid transactions.

The additional person would only transfer funds if the Treasurer is unavailable for whatever reason.

Upon return of the Treasurer any transfers processed by the additional person would be validated by the Treasurer.

I wish to submit the proposal that someone else be allowed to access the club account.

The decision of who that person is, to be made by a club meeting.








