
Then on to the Margaret Whitlam Pavilion.

From the Editor

I have a couple of things to talk about this issue.

Firstly, I find that a number of the photos submitted for the F22 gallery are of quite poor quality. The computer is quite forgiving so photos viewed on screen via any of the photo viewers may look quite good, however the print media is quite different and the software I use emphases the lack of definition.

Consider this as an example.

This is a portion of a low-res photo as seen by my software.



So if you want your photos seen at their best, it is preferable to not reduce the file size (or if you do, not by much) even if you need to send photos in multiple emails. Typically images should be AT LEAST 1 MB. It is also nice to include information of where the photos were taken if it is not obvious.

A second problem is photos embedded in emails rather than sent as attachments. I've had this issue as Editor of a previous

newsletter for many years and I have never quite been able to work out the issue. My feeling is that some photos sent via a mobile phone are the ones that become embedded rather than those sent via software such as MS Outlook on a computer. Embedded images mean that I have to copy them into PhotoShop and save them, which also reduces the photo quality.

I've found however, that sometimes there is just no way around this for whatever reason, but please try to send photos as attachments rather than an embedded image in a message. I know not everyone is a computer expert and may not know how to do this or it may be due to the software you use and as I said, I haven't quite worked out why this happens.

However, a similar issue is if you send a Word document of a trip report or similar and include photos in the Word document. This also results in poor quality photos, having to copy them out and resave them.

If sending any item in a Word document and you want to include photos, please just send the text in the Word document and send any photos/images separately as jpeg files (or similar).

If you are unsure and feel you need advice on submitting images and reports please feel free to contact me and I'll see what I can do to help. I'd like to see your photos displayed at their best.

Lastly, since the Portrait Interest Group meetings are so close to the newsletter production and it takes time for members to upload their photos to the portal, some of the photos I've included in the F22 gallery were taken at the previous meeting. This will no doubt be an ongoing strategy.




Female Red-tailed Black Cockatoo Diane Cutting




