#### **President's report**

At the September meeting Kym Haines took us on an intriguing journey through the universe, light years out into space and shared some of the stunning images he has captured of The Milky Way and other galaxies with his camera/telescope setup. Thanks Kym.

Birds have charmed and held a certain fascination for photographers as a subject of study. They are all around us and we see and hear them every day and take it as a given, they are part of our environment. So, when they are not there we notice. In the last few weeks, I have been so pleased to see some of the smaller birds back in my garden. Little Silvereyes have been very scarce since the bush fires and drought, but this year appear to be increasing in numbers and we can hear the Spotted Pardalotes that nest in the bank calling close by.

The Aussie backyard bird count is back again this month, is it a rewarding way to get involved in monitoring the birds in your environment as a citizen scientist.

October is often the best time to spot birds because they are more active and easier to see during spring, which kicks off behaviours such as nesting and breeding so get involved in the Aussie bird count.

Our speaker this month is Diane Cutting a very experienced bird photographer and long-time member of SSCC. Lover of all that flies Diane will focus her presentation on Birds of Prey. I hope to see you there.

The 2022 Annual General Meeting will be held at 7.30 pm 17 November immediately prior to the presentation on "Underwater Photography" by Jen Thompson.

#### From the Editor


Website Manager


We had expected to be the only visitors but were soon confronted by a number of other photographers from U3A, who all presumed we were part of their group (my friend also being a keen photographer).










