Reports

President's report

Angela Robinson Buchanan was our guest speaker for August and she gave a terrific presentation. From a very young age in the UK where she was born, Angela has been interested in nature, animals and flora. As a child she discovered a spider she didn't recognise so sent it off in the post to the Natural History Museum. It turned out this species was not known in the UK at the time.

Angela has extensive knowledge in many genres of photography, firstly studying photography and printing at university and working in the industry for many years before moving to Australia. She explained, using her beautiful photographs of birds, the path she has taken in recent times as a wildlife carer, which has led to her photography winning awards, having multiple exhibitions, teaching workshops and writing and illustrating several children's books. For Angela it is essential that the birds and animals are photographed with respect – she never uses a flash and the well-being of the animal comes first. She had some beautiful photos of a tiny frogmouth she had raised that had fallen out of the nest before it could fly. Then it took a lot of preparation and patience to get the shot of a magpie one winter's morning, singing out condensation in her backyard. Angela runs workshops twice a year, which are all booked out. However she said if our Club had a group that was interested, she could run one for us. Let me know if there is interest and we can go from there. Great talk, thanks Angela.

After the coffee break I mentioned that the AGM will be held at the October meeting and that as I have been president for two years, I will be vacating the seat for someone else to have a turn. Kumar will also not be standing for re-election as Secretary. If anyone wants more information about committee positions, please don't hesitate to contact me.

This month's speaker will be Vicki Clarke and she will be inspiring us with her fascination for whales. Now is the time to catch a glimpse of the Humpback whales making their long migration down Australia's eastern coastline with their young. Orroral Homestead outing

A number of members met for an excursion to the Orroral Homestead in Namadgi National Park.

Situated near the site of the Orroral space tracking station, the homestead was built for Archibald and Mary McKeahnie for grazing in the 1860s. It has three rooms and a chimney at each end, plus a full length verandah at the front. The original kitchen and staff quarters were built behind, and were as large as the house. The main chimney for the kitchen remains.



We parked at the renovated tracking station picnic area and wandered on down to the homestead, cautiously watched by the many kangaroos, either grazing or simply lounging on the grass.



The old corral seemed of particular interest to the roos to congregate within.

There were very few birds with a grey butcherbird heard calling in the distance and a few shy Superb Fairy Wrens flitting around the picnic area.

On the far distant ranges we spotter a pair of Little Eagles being harassed by a Wedge-tailed Eagle, but they were too far distant for even our long lens to get a decent shot.

The old shearing shed still stands and there were the remnants of old stoves nearby.

After a wander round the old homestead. We headed up the hill to a spot that looked out over the homestead and valley. It was in a gully before heading up the slope that I spotted a couple of female Flame Robins. A male Scarlet Robin was found on our descent while looking for the Flame Robins.

Back at the picnic area a male Scarlet Robin was hunting nearby, the Superb Fairy Wrens made another appearance and a few other species made their appearance while we had a quiet lunch.

I had previously been to the old tracking station site and while I had heard of the homestead I hadn't realised just where it was so I was very pleased to have made this trip and hopefully get some decent photos in return.
















