President's report

For our next meeting on Thursday, 21 March, Club member David Godden will be presenting a talk titled: *A Fungus Odyssey*.

David moved to Canberra from Tamworth in late 2022.He came originally from the Riverina, finished school in Tamworth, attended UNE (agricultural economics), lived in Lismore, Sydney, London (post-graduate study), and returned to Tamworth in 2015. He worked for the NSW government, and taught at Sydney University - in all agencies, agricultural and environmental/natural resource economics.

Commonwealth Avenue Bridge report

One of three traffic routes across the waters of the lake (counting Scrivener Dam), the Commonwealth Avenue Bridge is by far the most central and trafficked crossing and has had little modification in its 60 years of service.

The decision to run a light rail structure across the lake in the gap between the north and south spans of the bridge will potentially change the pleasant aesthetics of the existing bridge spans. Consequently, SSCC members were challenged to come along and capture the bridge as it is as a record for future reference.

Eight members accepted the challenge and found their way to the northern base of the bridge early enough while it was agreeably cool and providing good reflections and shadows to emphasise the bridge's structure, detail and its lakeside vista of green lawns and trees.




Having lived in Canberra for 50+ years, I find it hard to get enthusiastic about the scenes Canberra offers and a little guilty seeing other photographers, presumably visitors, happily snapping selfies against the lake, the bridge and its surroundings. It made me think I need to see Canberra in a different light and photograph it differently, in a more interesting way. This video is highly recommended for anyone interested in making portraits without the currently fashionable glitz and glitter.
















